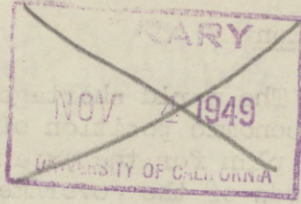

LINSEED COSTS INVESTIGATION 1948.

(INTERIM REPORT)

The fulfillment of the livestock production program is dependent on a regular supply of certain feeds, and much of this demand must be met from the home grown linseed crop. The linseed crop is to be produced by the crop is illustrated by the production figures which have been set: 100,000 acres in 1948, 100,000 acres in 1949, and 100,000 acres in 1950. These may be compared with a total linseed acreage for both 1948 and 1949 of about 1,000,000 acres.

Comparatively few farms in the home production program in linseed in 1948. Some have had experience of the crop for some years, but many have only had a few years' experience. It is in fact the majority of the crop which will be a new crop. With this fact in mind the Department of Agricultural Economics has been collecting data on the costs of growing, harvesting and storing the crop during 1948-49. For all the linseed crops have been included in this investigation. It is hoped that an interim report giving all the information that is available will be presented later.
